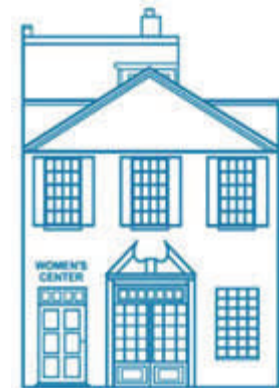

About the Center

Since 1973, Women's Rights Information Center has been helping women adapt to a changing society. The Center's staff and volunteers serve more than 9,000 individuals and families each year, from clients who require weeks or months of intensive training and support, to those who need immediate assistance or have a quick question.

The Center receives 40 to 50 calls a day about employment services, computer training, housing, legal issues, workshops, ESL classes, career counseling, resumé writing, volunteer opportunities or community resource information.

Other non-profit groups use our meeting rooms on a space available, low cost basis.

Volunteering

The Center's volunteers come with a wide range of skills, including professionals who present workshops and classes, computer experts who provide technology support, Women Lawyers In Bergen, who provide on-site consultations, corporate and social service professionals who sit on advisory committees, and student interns who help the Center while gaining valuable work experience. Other volunteers with varied life experience help staff the office by providing a caring voice on the telephone, researching grant opportunities, and offering valuable support in countless ways.

Annual Celebrations

Annual celebrations include Elizabeth Cady Stanton's birthday, with the "World is Moving" awards, walk and reception; Women's History Month programs; Women's Equality Day commemorating the Suffrage Amendment; Volunteer Recognition Day; and many more special events.
